OUR STORY

From humble beginnings in 1910, with just 26 boys on the roll, Glenwood High School has grown into one of the leading schools in KwaZulu-Natal and South Africa.

In 1915, the school was renamed Technical High School, Durban. By the end of World War I in 1918, 25 Old Boys and one staff member had made the ultimate sacrifice. Their memory lives on today through the memorials around the school and our annual Remembrance Day Service, where their legacy is honoured.

In January 1929, Glenwood moved to its current home in McDonald Road, and in 1934, officially adopted the name Glenwood High School. The Government Schools Hostel opened a year later, in 1935, providing accommodation for boarders.

After World War II, the hostel was renamed Gibson House in memory of Roy Gibson, one of Glenwood's original boarders who lost his life in the war. His courage and character continue to represent the spirit of every Gibson House boy.

For more than a century, Glenwood has been shaping young men of character, leadership, and excellence. Our story is not only about the achievements of a few, but about the thousands of boys who have walked through our gates, each contributing to a proud tradition that continues to inspire future generations.





THE SCHOOL BADGE

The Glenwood badge features a shield on a green field, symbolising growth and strength.

Across the shield runs a bend bearing three golden trees (d'or), a tribute to the original Glenwood area, which was once covered in natural bushland.

On the right, the original crest is retained to honour the school's historical roots, while on the left, a falcon represents determination, focus, and a love for outdoor sport, qualities deeply embedded in Glenwood's spirit.

The diagonal bar across the badge signifies the school's separation from the Technical College (now the Durban University of Technology) in 1929, when Glenwood, then known as the Technical High School, moved to its current site.

The school's official name, Glenwood High School, was adopted in 1934, marking the beginning of a proud new chapter in its history.

SICK REPORT

If you feel too ill to stay in class, you may ask the teacher for permission to go to the Grade Head but not before first break.

CONDUCT WHILE REPRESENTING THE SCHOOL

A Glenwood boy is required to:

Meet all applicable dress requirements.

Be courteous and helpful. Greet and assist parents/visitors to the school Neither through action nor word bring discredit to either himself or the school.



DETENTION

ACADEMIC and CLEANING detention will be held every day from 14:30 – 16:30 (or longer for 'special cases'). Boys will sign detention slips for the following day of the offence, or day after only. Detention will be controlled by the Prefects and supervised by a member of Staff.

If a boy is placed on detention it is to take PRIORITY OVER ALL OTHER ACTIVITIES AND ARRANGEMENTS.

The member of management on duty will investigate absences from detention. Failure to attend detention could result in: suspension; double detention the following week; or HEADMASTER'S DETENTION, WHICH IS HELD EVERY AFTERNOON FROM 14:30 – 16:30. This takes priority over all arrangements and activities, and parents will be notified.

Letters of notification will be sent to the parents of those boys who are placed on detention on a regular basis.

It is in your own interest to maintain high standards at Glenwood, so please co-operate in this regard. Make every effort to avoid being placed on detention and so also avoid the resulting complications.

HOMEWORK POLICY

Each boy is to have a **Homework Diary** in which he is to record the homework set each day. Please do not accept the excuse that no homework has been set. Revision, consolidation and preparation should take place every night.



ELECTRONIC DEVICES POLICY

We appeal to you as parents to support us in ensuring that your son does not endanger himself or others by carrying expensive equipment around to and from school, and that he does not allow himself to distract himself, other boys and Staff away from the learning process.

Should boys bring an electronic device to school it will be confiscated for a Term if he is found using it / playing with it at school without consent.

We therefore would like to remind Parents about our policy with regard to electronic devices at school:

- Any goods reported stolen will see both parties being punished should negligence be found on behalf of the person from whom the goods were allegedly stolen.
- Cell phone used for 'cheating' purposes: As per KZNSC regulations: "In terms of the KwaZulu-Natal Senior Certificate Examination regulations any candidate found to be in possession of a cell phone while he is writing an examination will be non-resulted.

LOCKER REGULATIONS

You have to apply for a locker, the annual cost is R100.00 payable to the Finance Office. Present your receipt to the Grade Head to be assigned a locker.



No boy may change the lock on his locker without first consulting the Grade Head.

All lockers are cleared out at the end of every academic year. Boys are expected to remove all personal items by the close of school each year. Locks are cut off if lockers are not cleared and the contents are disposed of to a charity.

At the Green Machine, we have a Counselling Department, which is a big name for a simple idea: a safe place for you to come, when you need someone to listen, when you need to talk freely, and where you will get help to assist you in finding solutions. We have an open-door policy which means we will work around your timetable.

Who Are We?

Mr and Mrs Waters are your school counsellors, and we are both here to support you. Our counselling office is at the back of the Library, next to the Gordon Murray Conference Room. We are here to help you make the most of your years at Glenwood, together we are here to assist in the process of **building great men**.

What Can You Come to Us For?

Basically anything, but remember that your FIRST "go to" person is your Register Class teacher. Let your Reg Teacher know and they will link up with us on your behalf. Remember, high school is bigger and there is more on the go: more homework, new friends, bigger classrooms, more staff, more sport... If in doubt, let your Register Teacher know right away at the start of a day. Then we will get an appointment set up so that you can pop around at a time that do not add any further stress to your school day.

Let your Register Teacher know when you:

- start feeling overwhelmed whether by homework or classwork
- begin to struggle with getting yourself organised
- can't figure out how to study for the first standardised tests on Thursday's
- are having problems with friends, new or old
- find it hard to fit in or you are struggling to make new friends once the "Welcome Camp" camaraderie has worn off a little
- feel stressed, anxious, or just a bit down and not sure why
- are worried about something at school, or to do with sport, or something has happened at home, like moving house, or a family member has fallen ill etc

CAMBRIDGE INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION

Established in 2016, Glenwood Cambridge International School is registered to offer the Cambridge Upper Secondary curriculum to boys and girls. The co-ed programme consist of three phases, IGCSE, AS Level and A Level.

Learners may join the programme either in Grade 8 or Grade 9 and will complete their IGCSE qualification over a period of two years. During this phase six of the following subjects needs to be completed before moving to phase two: English, Afrikaans, Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry, Physics and/or Computer Science. Learners may choose additional subjects as a self-study if the aforementioned subjects do not meet their academic needs.

CAMBRIDGE INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION

Moving to AS Level, phase two, learners will carry their IGCSE subjects forward with the exception of Afrikaans. For university purposes only IGCSE Afrikaans (or any other second language) is required. Therefore, for AS Level learners only have to complete five subjects.

Phase three, A Level, is required for students wanting to study abroad. To qualify for A Level, students must maintain a 70% and above aggregate throughout their schooling during phase two. From the five AS level subjects, learners must carry forward three A Level subjects as a minimum requirement.

Apart from being a registered Cambridge school, we are also registered as a Cambridge Examination centre. Private candidates may write their theory and practical exams at our centre. For exams conducted in a laboratory, i.e. Chemistry, Physics and Biology, we offer practical workshops prior to the exam. All examinations are set and marked by the University of Cambridge International Examinations board in the United Kingdom. Exams can either be written in May / June or October / November.

Cambridge International provides learners with an outstanding education. It promotes critical thinking, creativity and a global view.



The courts served as a vibrant hub of activity, hosting internal Ladder fixtures, a thriving squash academy, and League Squash matches. Toppy's legacy lives on through the energy and enthusiasm that continue to define these courts.



MIKE TURRELL PAVILION

The building was completed in August 2000 and named after **Mike Turrell**, previously the Chairman of the Old Boys' Association and Treasurer of eThekwini Municipality, as well as the driving force behind building the Pavilion. The building uniquely affords views of the fields, and the pool and houses a gym and a 60-seater conferencing facility.

SWIMMING POOL



To mark Glenwood's centenary in 2010, funds were sought for an Old Boys' Pavilion, leading to the construction of the Ivan Clark Pavilion. Its ground floor features changing rooms and an ice bath for cricket and rugby, with additional space leased to Medical Practitioners on Campus. The second floor offers an expansive entertainment and viewing area exclusively for Old Boys' Association Members, Patrons, and Ivan Clark Pavilion Season Ticket holders. Ivan Clark, a Glenwood alum (Class of 1961) and former Grindrod chairman, retired in 2014 after 37 years with the company. As CEO from 1999 to 2006, Grindrod attained top listings in both South Africa and the global shipping industry.



THREE SCHOOLS TRUST & DOKKIES

Glenwood High School, together with Durban Girls High and Penzance Primary, are part of the "Three Schools Trust" which is responsible for the Astroturf at 17 Acton Rd, Umbilo. This Astroturf affords our boys the opportunity to play on the latest technology of Astroturf Management. Soccer and squash are played at the Dokkies Educational Trust fields at 321 ZK Mathews Rd.

It is estimated that he will reach the 1st stop on Windermere Road at 06h40 moving onto Sutton Park, Windermere Shopping Centre, departing at 06h50 making its way via Essenwood Road and Cowey Road to school. The estimated time of arrival at school is 07h10.

The bus returns on the same route, leaving school at 17h10.

On the odd occasion that your son plays sports away from Glenwood and is going to return after 17h10, kindly make alternate transport arrangements as the bus cannot be delayed for one boy.

Bus tickets need to be purchased upfront for the month, and a ticket will be issued by the School. Please note that should boys not produce the bus ticket, they will not be allowed on the bus. Glenwood High School runs a school bus service to <u>Highway</u>, <u>Pinetown</u> and <u>Dawncliffe</u> areas as follows:

Due to the high demand for this route and our limited space, we introduced two busses daily for the Pinetown route, however, please be aware that this is dependent on bus capacities and can be changed should we make changes to our fleet. Details below for departure/arrival times for Bus 1 and Bus 2 for the Pinetown route.

Pinetown Route:

1st bus: Departs from Shell Garage (Opp. Knowles Centre) Cnr St Johns Avenue & Bamboo Lane at 06h10 via Durban North — Estimated time of arrival at school at 07h30.

Departs from school at 15h00 – 15h30 and will only go as far as Pinetown.

2nd bus: To assist with the overflow, the HW bus will arrive at approx. 06h20 but space is limited on this bus and therefore the majority will go on the earlier bus. Those boys that did not make it onto the 1st bus will only have to wait about 10 mins.

Departs from school at 17h10 following the entire route back to Highway.

NB: **ALL BOYS** must be at the collection point before 06h10, the 1st bus will collect as many boys as possible and depart at 06h10. The second bus has limited space and will arrive approx. 06h20 (the overflow boys will only have to wait 10 mins).

Highway/Dawncliffe:

Departs from Shell Garage (opposite Oxford), Hillcrest at 06h00 and departs from the Shell Garage, Pioneer Road, Kloof at 06h15.

Makes its way to Shell Garage (Opp. Knowles Centre) Cnr St Johns Avenue & Bamboo Lane, Pinetown to arrive at approx. 06h20 (See Pinetown route info above).

It will then go onto Dawncliffe and departs from Blair Athol Off/Onramp (At old Westville Centre) at 06h35.

The bus returns on the same route, leaving school at 17h10.

On the odd occasion that your son plays sports away from Glenwood and is going to return after 17h10, kindly make alternate transport arrangements as the bus cannot be delayed for one boy.

Bus tickets need to be purchased upfront for the month, and a ticket will be issued by the School. Please note that should boys not produce the bus ticket, they will not be allowed on the bus. As space is limited it is on a first-come, first-serve basis, and once all tickets purchased for that month are sold, there will not be any tickets available until the following month. Should the bus not be filled, casual tickets can be purchased the day before the use of the bus, no ticket = no ride.

Bluff / Montclair Bus Route 2026: Glenwood High School is pleased to offer a dedicated transport service for learners residing in the **Bluff** and **Montclair** areas. This route provides safe and reliable transport directly to and from the School each day.

In the mornings, the bus will collect learners at **Nando's Bluff (Pick 'n Pay Centre, 201 Tara Road)** at **06:20**, followed by a second pick-up at the **Engen Garage on Roland Chapman Drive in Montclair** at **06:45**. The bus will then proceed to Glenwood High School, arriving at approximately 07:10.

In the afternoons, the bus will depart from Glenwood High School at 17:10. The first drop-off will again be at **Nando's Bluff (Pick 'n Pay Centre, Tara Road)**, followed by the final drop-off at the **Engen Garage on Roland Chapman Drive in Montclair**. Drop-off times may vary slightly depending on traffic.

As traffic conditions can fluctuate, learners are encouraged to be ready at least five minutes before the scheduled pick-up time. Seats are limited, and booking is essential. All learners are expected to comply with the School's transport code of conduct while using the bus service.

On occasions when boys participate in sports matches away from Glenwood and are expected to return after 17:10, parents are kindly requested to make alternate transport arrangements, as the bus cannot be delayed for individual learners.

Bus tickets must be purchased upfront for the month, and a ticket will be issued by the School. Learners who do not present their bus ticket will unfortunately not be permitted to board the bus. As space is limited, tickets are sold on a first-come, first-served basis. Once all monthly tickets have been sold, no additional tickets will be available until the following month. In cases where the bus is not fully booked, casual tickets may be purchased the day before travel, but the same rule applies, no ticket, no ride.

A member of the Resident Staff is nominated as Duty Master each day. Routine daily requests should be directed to Ms V Wilesmith.

Special requests, including permission to leave Gibson House, must be addressed to the Superintendent, who is available during school hours and via the Gibson House contact number listed on the front page. All requests to leave the House must be submitted in writing and in good time.

Recreational Facilities

Gibson House provides extensive recreational facilities, including: Television (DSTV), gym (only Grade 10 - 12), foosball, pool table, table tennis, piano, giant chess set. tuckshop, braai area, putt-putt course.

Supervised access to school fields and swimming pool Boarders are encouraged to make full use of these facilities to stay engaged and active.

Sport

Gibson House participates as a separate house in Inter-House competitions. All boarders are expected to participate fully in school activities.

- A minimum of one summer and one winter sport is mandatory.
- Medical exemptions require a doctor's certificate.

Dress Code

School Uniform must be worn:

- Daily to school
- On Saturday mornings when leaving and returning to Gibson House
- To all school functions
- When leaving or returning during free weekends and holidays



Uniform guidelines:

- Shoes: plain black, lace-up
- Jerseys: dark green if worn with uniform
- Jewellery: not permitted
- Shirts: white, long-sleeved; short sleeves permitted in summer
- Socks: grey
- Broad leather belts: not permitted
- Grey shorts & stockings: Grades 8 & 9 may wear instead of flannels
- Minimum of 3 pairs of grey flannels recommended

Casual Wear

- Neat, respectable dress is allowed on Sundays and during outings.
- Daily afternoon and weekend wear: plain black or green Quantec shorts with badge, plain white or School T-shirt.
- Boys must have slippers or slip-on sandals, towels, soap, and polish shoes daily.
- Hair must be neat and short; boys must return each term with a regulation haircut.

Essential Items:

- School bag, sports bag, uniform, tracksuit, towels, sheets, pillowcases, black duvet, laundry bags, coat hangers, shoe polish kit.
- All clothing and personal items must be clearly marked with a laundry marker.

Academic Work

Boarders have two prep sessions each weekday evening. Underachieving students may be required to attend additional 'gated' prep sessions. Parents are asked not to request exemptions, as these sessions are designed to support their son's progress.



Telephone and Communication

- Calls should not be made during prep or after 20:45.
- Cell phones are not permitted during meals, prep, or after lights out.
- The office phone is only for emergencies.

Times and Attendance

- Boys must return by 16:00 on the day before a term starts (new boys: 14:00).
- Sunday return: 20:00, Monday morning: 06:40.
- Free weekends require applications by Wednesday afternoon.

Exeat Rules

- All absences from the House must be approved via an exeat.
- Boys must sign out and in with the Master-on-Duty.
- Written parental consent and host family invitations are required for non-home destinations.

Transport

- Transport is provided to/from Durban bus depots via King Shaka shuttles 0823409990 (approx. 40–50 minutes; R120 per trip).
- Boys must make arrangements outside of normal school hours.

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

REGARDING: FOOD LEVY IN 2026

In our commitment to providing a higher-quality boarding experience at Gibson House, we will be introducing a Food Levy in 2026. This initiative is aimed at enhancing the standard of nutrition currently offered to our boarders, ensuring their wellbeing and supporting a positive, well-rounded boarding environment.

The Food Levy is payable upfront, either monthly or termly, by boarders on a discounted fee structure (i.e., those receiving a bursary).

The levy is set at **R100** per day or **R3,000** per month.

This levy does not apply to full-fee-paying boarders.

Indicative Rates:

- 100% Bursary: R3,000 per month
- 75% Bursary: R2,250 per month
- 50% Bursary: R1,500 per month
- 25% Bursary: R750 per month

January and July will be billed at half the monthly rate, while December will carry no charge, effectively spreading the annual fee over 10 months. (February – November inclusive).
